- Opportunities for engagement with others, and to have an active role in the local, national and global community.



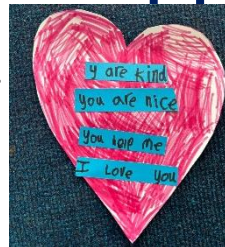
